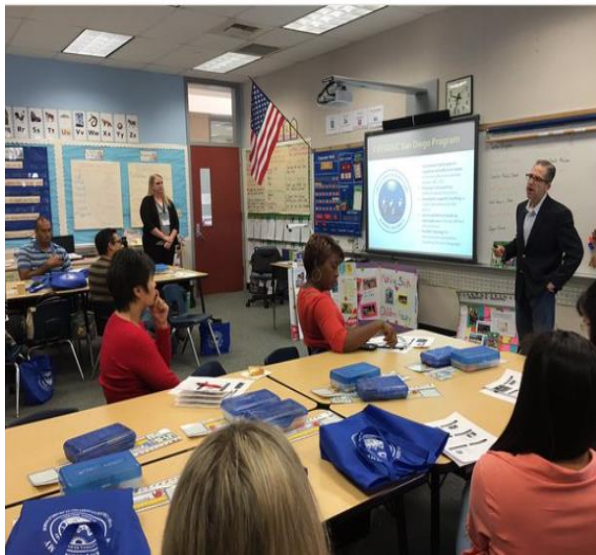


PARENT ENGAGEMENT

PURPOSE

To develop and prepare students with linguistic and academic competencies in two languages, to be highly engaged and contributing global citizens.

MISSION

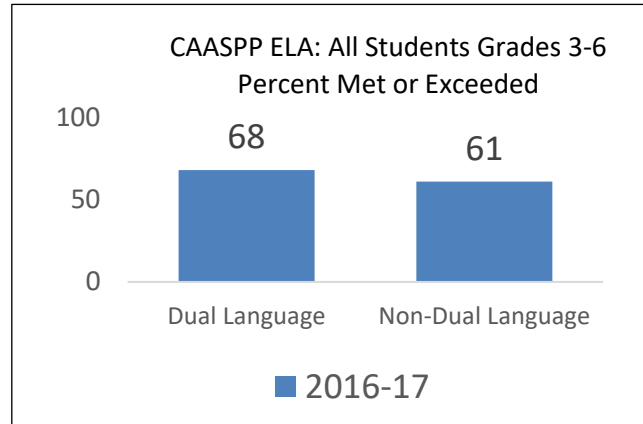
PROGRAM GOALS

All Dual Language Immersion Program students will become bilingual, biliterate, and develop positive cross-cultural attitudes and behaviors.



DEFINITION

The Dual Language Immersion Program integrate native Spanish-speaking students and native English-speaking students. Instruction is provided in both native language and English. This specialized program promotes bilingualism, biliteracy, grade-level academic achievement, and positive cross-cultural awareness.

BILITERACY AWARD

The District established a “Biliteracy Award” as a pathway to honor Grade 6 students in the Dual Language Immersion Program for participation in two or more languages. Students will be required to meet specific criteria to be eligible for the award. Additional information is available at schools.

GUIDELINES FOR ENGLISH INSTRUCTION AND PROFICIENCY

Structured English Immersion services are designed to increase English proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing through the content areas is part of the program at all grade levels. English Language Development begins in Transitional Kindergarten and continues until English Learner students meet criteria for reclassification as Fluent English Proficient.

PROGRAM MODELS:

- 90/10:** Spanish is used as the primary language of instruction, while English gradually increases throughout the grade levels.
- 50/50:** Half of the instructional day is in English and half in Spanish for all grade levels.
